

NINETY-FIFTH SESSION

Judgment No. 2267

The Administrative Tribunal,

Considering the second complaint filed by Mr V. G. against the International Labour Organization (ILO) on 14 October 2002;

Considering Article II, paragraph 1, of the Statute of the Tribunal and Article 7 of its Rules;

Having examined the written submissions;

CONSIDERATIONS

1. In Judgment 2071, delivered on 12 July 2001, the Tribunal refused to set aside a decision by which the Director-General of the International Labour Office - the ILO's secretariat - confirmed his previous decision not to renew the complainant's contract, but granted him retroactively a one-year extension as well as 30,000 United States dollars in compensation for administrative mistakes made by the Office and 2,000 dollars in costs.

2. In a letter dated 9 July 2002, confirmed by an e-mail dated 18 July, the Director of the Human Resources Development Department rejected certain further claims which the complainant had submitted on 11 March 2002.

The complainant has submitted a second complaint to the Tribunal to protest against that rejection. He claims the reimbursement of expenses for proceedings before the Joint Committee, the payment of two months' salary in lieu of notice, an award of damages for the injury suffered and costs.

3. The Tribunal can but refer the complainant to Judgment 2071, which settled all the issues concerning the compensation he claimed, regarding the non-renewal of his contract, the consequences of the mistakes made by the Office and the question of costs for the proceedings before the Joint Committee.

4. Since the object of the complainant's pleas is to challenge matters which are now *res judicata*, the Tribunal dismisses the complaint as being clearly devoid of merit in accordance with the summary procedure provided for in Article 7 of its Rules.

DECISION

For the above reasons,

The complaint is dismissed.
