

➤ Engaging the Private sector: employer's organizations, trade unions and management, workers representatives at the workplace level.

Government + Workers + Employers

- ➤ Collaborate with UNWTO: mobilize hotel chains, airlines services, tour operators and tour agents.
- ➤ Promote PPP with national parties representing Tourism
- > Partnership with "new" Donors.



> Scale up BCC workplace programmes.

- ➤ Integrate of HIV/AIDS in HRD + OSH programmes.
- Cooperate with vocational hotel and training schools (HIV/AIDS sessions during student holidays before summer hotel internships).
- Focusing on tourism workers: trainings in "low" tourism season before "peak" season.
- ➤ Linking actions to major events related to tourism sector (FIFA World Cup 2010).







