










## Developing skills for green jobs through South-South cooperation and vocational training


Developing the right skills for green jobs is the prerequisite for making the transition to a greener economy happen. With the support of the ILO, the technical vocational education and training (TVET) institutions of Central America (Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama) and the Dominican Republic have jointly developed learning standards and curricula for green jobs and incorporated them into the national training portfolios.





Promoting environmental protection through social protection floors and South-South learning

Combining social protection floors with environmental conservation can generate employment and income opportunities for population groups who are often left out from social programmes. Brazil's bolsa verde (green grant) programme promotes social inclusion and encourages the conservation of Brazilian's ecosystems. In cooperation with the ILO, Brazil will engage in a South-South cooperation project that includes a mapping and sharing of best practices

Sharing Good Environmental Practices in construction "building renewable energy"

among various countries from the South to help

scale up similar programmes in all the countries

Training of professionals in the construction sector has led to the implementation of good environmental practices on construction sites. The training project provides the skills to build photovoltaic solar bags (independent equipment able to provide electricity by converting solar energy for domestic use), which are then donated to schools that do not have electricity in different rural areas. This Argentinian experience has been shared with workers' unions from the Americas to develop and strengthen similar programmes in their countries.
