**RECORD VOTE ON THE RESOLUTIONS
CONCERNING THE ARREARS OF CONTRIBUTIONS
OF COMOROS AND PARAGUAY**

The PRESIDENT

Today we shall conduct the record vote on the resolutions concerning the arrears of contributions of two countries. You will recall that these resolutions were submitted in the first report of the Finance Committee of Government Representatives, approved by the Conference at its 13th sitting held yesterday. They were published, together with the Finance Committee's first report, in *Provisional Record* No. 8-1, and are as follows: resolution concerning the arrears of contributions of Comoros and resolution concerning the arrears of contributions of Paraguay.

I should like to recall that, in accordance with article 13, paragraph 4, of the Constitution of the ILO, the Conference may, by a two-thirds majority of the votes cast by the delegates present, permit a Member of the Organization in arrears in the payment of its financial contribution to vote if the Conference is satisfied that the failure to pay is due to conditions beyond the Member's control.

Under article 19, paragraph 5, of the Standing Orders of the Conference, such a vote must be a record vote.

(A record vote is taken.)

(The detailed results of the vote will be found at the end of the record of this sitting.)

The result of the vote concerning the arrears of contributions of Comoros is as follows: 299 votes in favour, 9 against, with 18 abstentions. As the quorum was 304, and the required two-thirds majority of 206 has been reached, the resolution concerning the arrears of contributions of Comoros is adopted.

(The resolution is adopted.)

The result of the vote concerning the arrears of contributions of Paraguay is as follows: 298 votes in favour, 9 against, with 19 abstentions. As the quorum was 304, and the required two-thirds majority of 205 has been reached, the resolution concerning the arrears of contributions of Paraguay is adopted.

(The resolution is adopted.)

SECOND REPORT OF THE SELECTION COMMITTEE: SUBMISSION, DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL

The PRESIDENT

We shall now move to the second item on our agenda, the examination of the second report of the Selection Committee, contained in *Provisional Record* No. 2-4.

The appendix to the report contains a resolution concerning remaining measures on the subject of Myanmar adopted under article 33 of the ILO Constitution.

I call on the Chairperson of the Selection Committee, Ambassador Dr Sukayri of Jordan, to present the report and the resolution.

Mr SUKAYRI (*Chairperson of the Selection Committee*)

It is my privilege to present to you the second report of the Selection Committee, which deals with the question of Myanmar. Let me say from the beginning that I consider that this report marks an important step in ILO history.

Since June 1996, when 25 workers' representatives filed an article 26 complaint against Myanmar for the massive use of forced labour and the violation of the Forced Labour Convention, 1930 (No. 29), the ILO and Myanmar have come a long way together.

Following the recommendations of the Commission of Inquiry, and the failure of the Government to implement them fully, the ILO adopted, for the first and only time in its history, measures against one of its Members under article 33 of the ILO Constitution. Since then, the ILO and Myanmar have been, as a former ILO Liaison Officer described it, in a long tango dance of forward and backward moves.

The report before you, which is published in *Provisional Record* No. 2-4, now proposes that you close the chapter of article 33 measures. This process already began last year, when the Conference left in place two of the restrictive measures it had adopted in 2000. The Selection Committee now proposes discontinuing these two remaining measures. We must note that their use was a success for the ILO. By persisting with the measures adopted, the ILO has shown its effectiveness and we have every reason to be proud.

However, it is now clear that the Government of Myanmar is collaborating. We no longer need to maintain the remaining measures to ensure implementation of the recommendations of the Commission of Inquiry. They have served their purpose.

While, with the agreement of the Conference, this important chapter will now be closed, the final chapter still needs to be written.

As we noted in the draft resolution, we are encouraged with the progress made by Myanmar in compliance with the Forced Labour Convention, 1930 (No. 29), while noting that more remains to be done. That is why we propose several actions for the Office, the Governing Body, the Government of Myanmar and the social partners in the country so that the Supplementary Understanding and the Memorandum of Understanding on the elimination of all forms of forced labour can produce the full and desired effects.

Just as ILO constituents have been resolute in implementing article 33 measures, so they remain united in their action today. As you can see from our report, there was a strong consensus leading to the adoption of the draft resolution that we now submit to the plenary for adoption.

Let me take advantage of this opportunity to thank the two Vice-Chairpersons and all other members of the Selection Committee for their collaborative spirit and their active contribution to this result. They have been ideal colleagues with which to work. With this, I invite the Conference to approve our report and adopt this historic resolution.

The PRESIDENT

I now open the general discussion on the report and the resolution.

Mr MATSUI (*Employer Vice-Chairperson of the Selection Committee*)

On behalf of the Employers' group, we welcome the work of the Selection Committee on the final lifting of the remaining article 33 measures.

We hope this opens a new chapter for the people of Myanmar and look forward to working with the ILO and the Liaison Office in Yangon to finally eradicate the systematic use of forced labour.

We would like to support the adoption of the report before us.

Mr CORTEBEECK (*Worker Vice-Chairperson of the Selection Committee*)

Dear colleagues, thank you for being here. The Assembly Hall is rather empty; maybe a lot of colleagues do not understand how important this part of the Conference is, but today marks a milestone on a long journey towards freedom that began many years ago. For over 20 years, workers around the world have campaigned to demand an end to the exaction of forced labour in Myanmar. Those ef-

forts eventually led to the establishment of an ILO Commission of Inquiry in 1997, and, in 2000, a resolution endorsing the imposition of sanctions by Members under article 33 of the ILO Constitution – an historic first for the ILO. Many Members around the world responded to that resolution. That step and the continued campaigning, in particular the tireless work of the FTUB (now FTUM) and its General Secretary, Maung Maung, has led us to this point today.

The Workers' group supports the Selection Committee's resolution which discontinues the application of the 2000 resolution. This decision recognizes the important steps that the Government of Myanmar has taken to combat forced labour in recent years, though recognizing that, according to credible reports, more work remains to be done. We hope that the Government, in cooperation with the ILO and in coordination with the workers and employers in Myanmar, redoubles its efforts to eliminate forced labour as soon as possible and ensures that those responsible for the exaction of forced labour are brought to justice.

In light of the discontinuation of the special sitting in the Committee on the Application of Standards, the Workers' group also welcomes the commitment to ongoing reporting on forced labour at the Governing Body. We invite the ILO to furnish full information on all of its activities under the Memorandum of Understanding and associated action plans. It is only with the complete and detailed picture that the Governing Body will be able to reach informed conclusions on Myanmar's implementation of these commitments and, consequently, the Government's anticipated compliance with Convention No. 29.

We have always maintained that there is a link between the exercise of freedom of association and the prevention of forced labour. The Workers' group thus also welcomes the text of the resolution calling for reporting on freedom of association, as well as the text in the report that calls upon Members and international organizations to support freedom of association in Myanmar, including by making available the necessary financial resources to the ILO Freedom of Association Project. We urge Members to ensure that this Project is in fact funded so as to provide the necessary training and support for the establishment of mature industrial relations in Myanmar. We appreciate the reporting on freedom of association and, indeed, the many accomplishments of this Project over the last year. We do note that concerns remain in respect to employer harassment of union leaders and workers undertaking organizing. We also note the issues highlighted around the registration process, particularly federations and confederations, and regret that the FTUM has still not been registered.

In more general terms, we would note that legislation with regard to freedom of association and collective bargaining, in our view, while a marked improvement over the past situation – in which no framework for the registration and operation of trade unions existed – still poses some obstacles to the full exercise of fundamental labour rights. We request the Government to begin a process to review and revise the legislation consistent with the fundamental Conventions and Recommendations of the ILO supervisory mechanism.

Finally, the text of the resolution calls for reporting on the impact of foreign direct investment on

decent working conditions in the country. We underscore the importance of reporting on investment. As trade and investment sanctions in place for many years are now removed, there has been a surge in interest in investment opportunities in Myanmar. There is no question that Myanmar needs investment; however, that investment must be responsible if it is to contribute to broadly-shared economic development. The reporting by the ILO could assist in developing a proactive strategy on this issue. We also suggest that the ILO use its convening role to bring together unions and employers in Myanmar to discuss at the national and sectoral levels the establishment of mature industrial relations.

Colleagues, we should take pride in the work of the ILO and its constituents in building a global consensus on the issue of forced labour in Myanmar. As Myanmar emerges from this dark chapter in its history, I hope that we can work together to establish a new foundation based on broadly-shared economic development and decent work.

Mr WOOLCOTT (*Ambassador to the United Nations in Geneva, Australia*)

As we said at the Selection Committee discussion, Australia welcomes the continued progress by the Government of Myanmar towards the application of Convention No. 29, and the steps that it has taken to promote and protect labour rights, which remains an important area of continuing reform for Myanmar.

In light of these positive developments, the Australian Government supports the discontinuation of the remaining measures imposed under paragraph 1 of the resolution adopted by the Conference in 2000 on the subject of Myanmar. This discontinuation of the measures will provide Myanmar with greater certainty in respect of its full and continuing access to ILO resources.

This will also assist Myanmar in fulfilling its commitments under the Memorandum of Understanding on forced and compulsory labour, and enable the positive steps taken so far to be sustained into the future.

Australia would like to acknowledge the work of the ILO, its member Governments, Workers and Employers and their perseverance and commitment to this cause. The ILO has played a key role in shaping the international community's approach to Myanmar. Measures taken at the 88th Session of the Conference in 2000, with a view to securing Myanmar's compliance with Convention No. 29, have enabled us to reach this historic decision point today.

This reflects well on the effectiveness and importance of the ILO's supervisory system in contributing to positive change and improving working conditions across the globe.

The Australian Government remains committed to supporting Myanmar's economic, political and social development. We look forward to working with Myanmar, as it continues to pursue important historical reforms, to improve its level of economic development, working conditions and the quality of life for its people.

**RESOLUTION CONCERNING REMAINING MEASURES
ON THE SUBJECT OF MYANMAR ADOPTED UNDER
ARTICLE 33 OF THE ILO CONSTITUTION: ADOPTION**

We now proceed to the adoption of the resolution concerning remaining measures on the subject of Myanmar adopted under article 33 of the ILO Constitution, which you will find at the end of *Provisional Record* No. 2-4.

If there are no objections, may I take it that the Conference adopts this resolution?

I now give the floor to His Excellency Mr Myint Thein, Deputy Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Security of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.

Mr THEIN (*Deputy Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Security, Myanmar*)

The resolution just adopted puts an end to the remaining measures on Myanmar adopted under article 33 of the ILO Constitution.

The prudent action by the ILO is the result of joint efforts by the ILO and national partners in Myanmar towards our shared goal of eliminating forced labour. This, in turn, testifies that our joint efforts are producing tangible progress and that the elimination of forced labour is within our reach. We are fully cognizant that more remains to be done. For its part, Myanmar will spare no efforts, with the assistance of the Office, until this goal is achieved, by 2015 or earlier.

I would like to express our thanks to all constituents of the ILO and our international partners for their support, not only in discontinuing the remaining measures on Myanmar, but also for their continued understanding, cooperation and support in our efforts to promote and protect the rights of our workers.

The PRESIDENT

This is indeed an historic moment for the ILO and for the Government of Myanmar – the culmination of many years of work and of considerable efforts undertaken, both by the Organization and by the Government. On behalf of the Conference, I should like to congratulate all concerned: the Government and people of Myanmar, of course, but also the ILO staff, who have followed this story in its twists and turns. A relatively small team from the ILO has been largely responsible for most of the contacts, and I hope that I am not neglecting anybody if I cite former Deputy Director-General Mr Kari Tapiola; the ILO Liaison Officer in Yangon, Mr Steve Marshall; Deputy Liaison Officer Ms Piyamal Pichaiwongse; Mr Drazen Petrovic, legal counsel on this matter; Mr Greg Vines, Deputy Director-General for Management and Reform; and, of course, the Director-General himself, Mr Guy Ryder, who has followed the story very closely indeed, and visited the country on mission on several occasions. My warmest congratulations to you all.

As the Chairperson of the Selection Committee said in his presentation, the final chapter of the story remains to be written. Progress has been very good,

but it is essential that the Government maintains its positive engagement with the ILO. If that happens, I think that we may look forward to a future in which forced or compulsory labour in Myanmar will truly become a thing of the past.

**SECOND REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE
OF GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES:
SUBMISSION AND APPROVAL**

The PRESIDENT

The next item before us is the submission and approval of the second report of the Finance Committee of Government Representatives, which is published in *Provisional Record* No. 8-2, and contains the resolution concerning the adoption of the Programme and Budget for 2014–15 and the allocation of the budget of income among member States.

I call on the Chairperson of the Finance Committee, Ms Hernández Narváez, to present the report.

Original Spanish: Ms HERNÁNDEZ NARVÁEZ (Chairperson and Reporter of the Finance Committee of Government Representatives)

It is an honour to present to the Conference the second report of the Finance Committee of Government Representatives. This can be found in *Provisional Record* No. 8-2, containing the Committee's recommendations on the issues which it examined.

The six resolutions which have been put forward by the Committee to the Conference for its adoption can be found at the end of the report. The main item on the Committee's agenda was the Programme and Budget proposals for 2014–15, which were put forward by the 317th Session of the Governing Body three months ago.

It is a pleasure for me to inform you that during the discussion of this item, the Committee noted the strong support expressed for the Organization and, in the report which is before you, you can see the different opinions voiced by the members during the debate. Although there was no consensus among the members of the Committee, because a number of States made it clear that they could only support a zero nominal growth budget, there was a vast majority in favour of the adoption of the proposals put forward by the Director-General for the 2014–15 budget.

I would like to call upon all of you, Governments, Employers and Workers, to offer a full measure of support for the resolution on the Programme and Budget for 2014–15.

The Committee then examined the scale of assessments of contributions to the ordinary budget of the ILO for 2014–15, and recommended that the Conference adopt this scale of assessments. This is based on the pro rata principle used by the United Nations.

The Committee also examined the proposed scale of assessments for new member States, of which there are two: South Sudan and Palau.

The Committee recommends that, in line with the established practice of harmonizing the scale of assessments of the Members of the ILO with the scale of assessments used for the United Nations system, the Conference should adopt the recommended annual rates.

The Committee also had a proposal before it for the composition of the ILO Administrative Tribunal. This was adopted anonymously. The Governing

Body had suggested that Mr Rouiller of Switzerland and Mr Frydman of France be renewed in their roles for a period of three years.

The Committee also examined the financial report and the audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2012. The External Auditor had given an unreserved positive opinion on the financial statements, which were fully in line with the International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS).

The External Auditor recognized that this was a major achievement on the part of the Office, but also suggested that both financial and non-financial information should be informing the work of the Office.

The Committee did not hesitate to recommend the adoption of the accounts and statements for the year ended 31 December 2012, under article 29 of the Financial Regulations.

The Committee also examined the document on the make-up of the ILO Staff Pension Committee, and unanimously recommended that the Conference appoint Mr Montant for the Government of Switzerland; Mr Bernard for the Employers; and Mr Blondel for the Workers to serve for a period of three years until 8 October 2016.

The Committee also examined two requests for recovery of the right to vote, from Paraguay and Comoros. The report on this item can be found in *Provisional Record* No. 8-1, which has been submitted to the Conference.

I should like to conclude by expressing my gratitude for the work carried out by the members of the Committee, the members of the secretariat, the interpreters and the translators. Thanks to all of them, we have enjoyed very clear and precise texts which have allowed us to discharge our mandate in this Committee. This has also led to the production of the report which the Conference has before it today.

I would like, therefore, to submit the report and the resolutions to the Conference for approval and adoption.
