	<b>Donor &amp; Budget</b> United States Department of Labour(USDOL)	<b>Objective</b> The survey was undertaken to inform policy planning and programme interventions by the Government of Sri Lanka, the workers, the employers and other stakeholders who have an interest in child rights and youth employment related issues in general and the issue of child labour in particular.
