

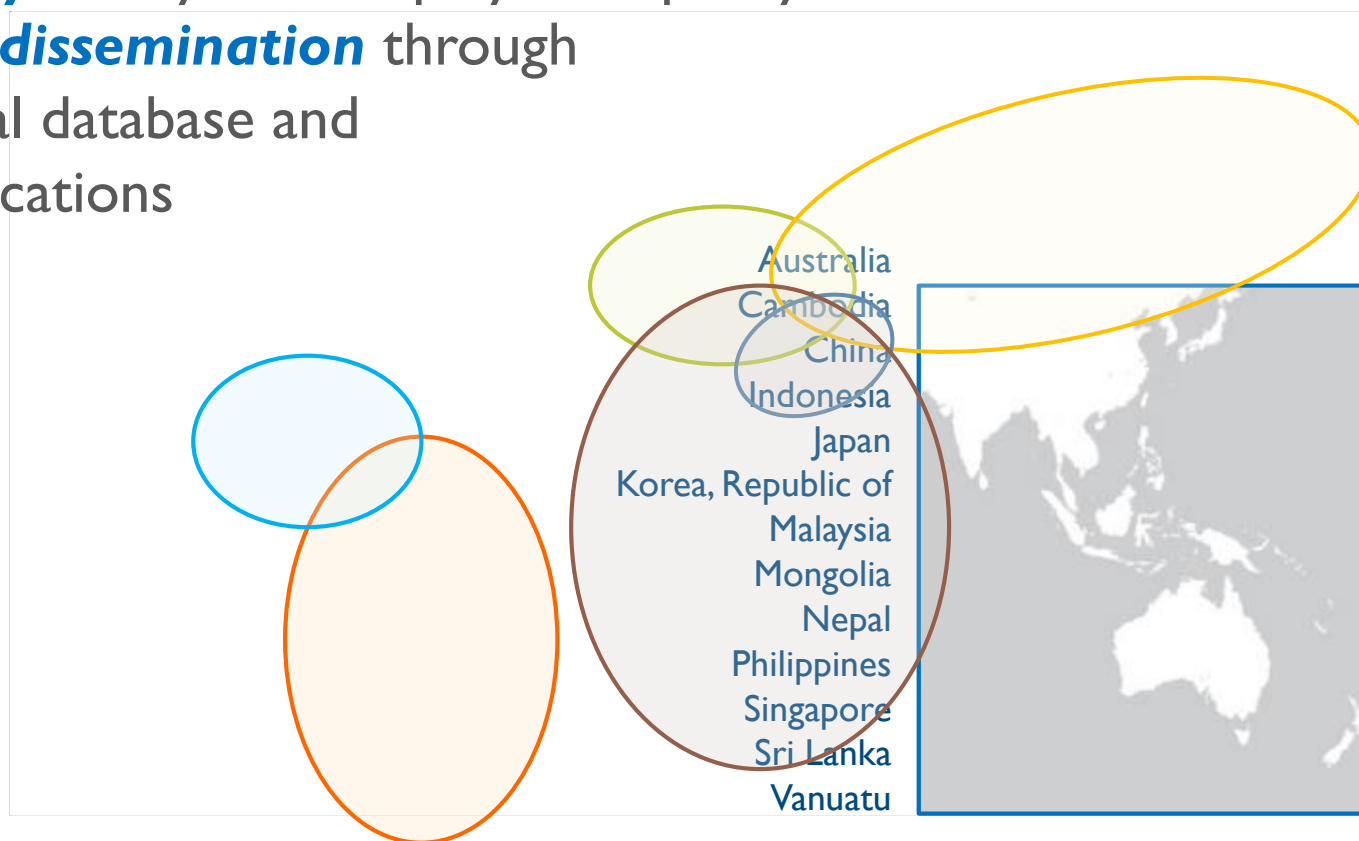

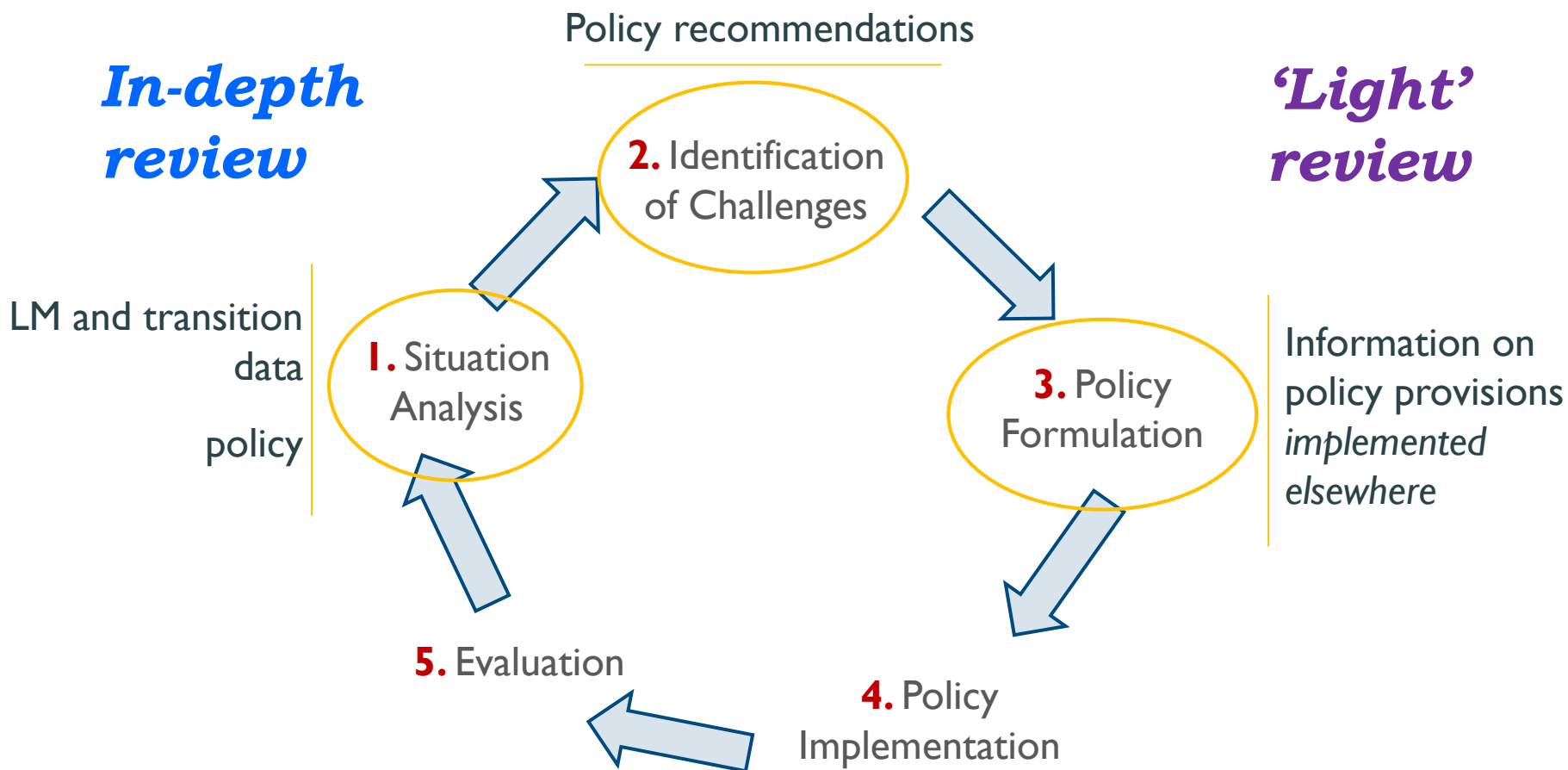

In-depth reviews are stepping stones to policy development



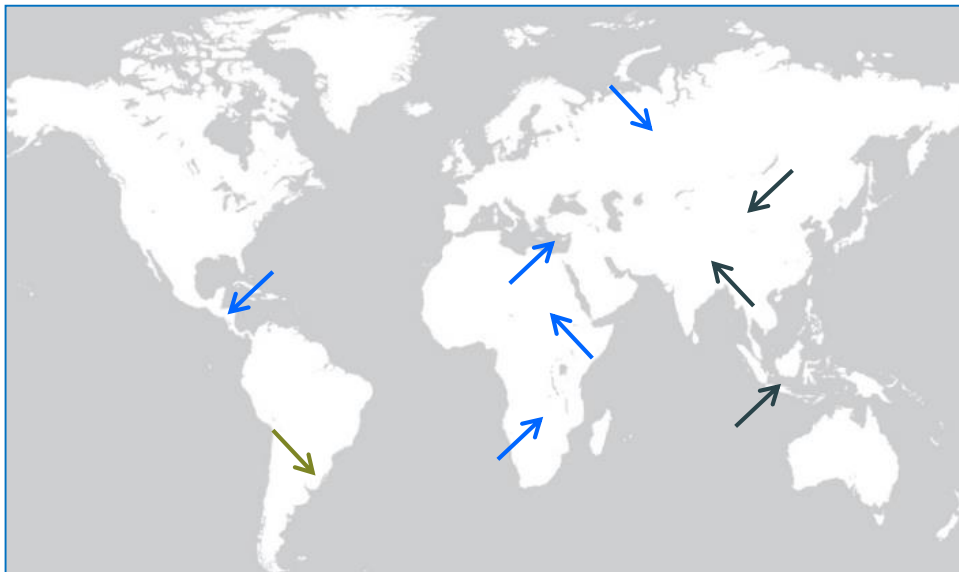
What: Clear understanding of national YE issues and draw conclusions for policy-making

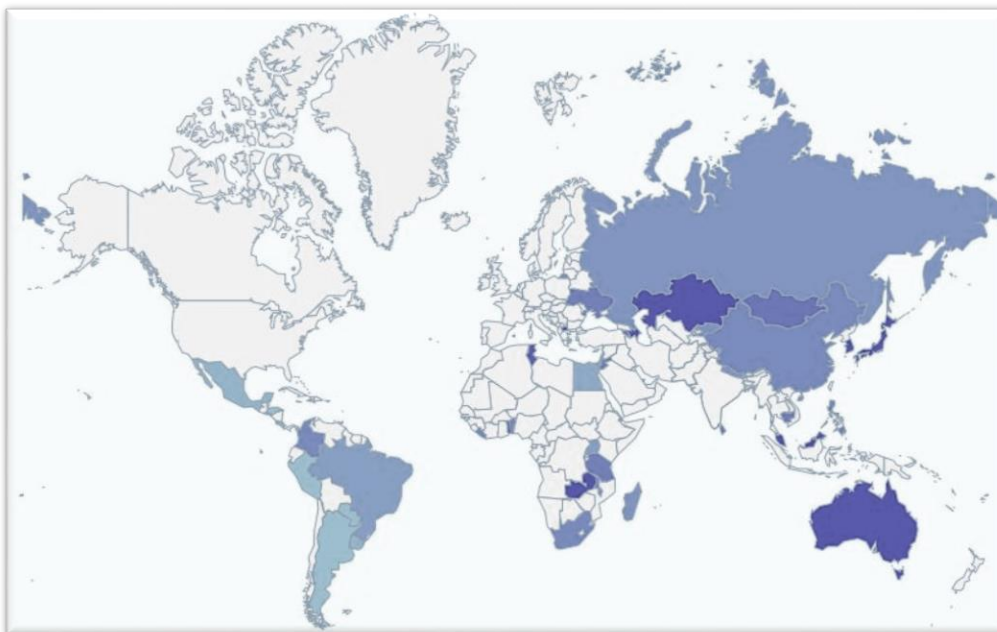


‘Light’ Reviews inform policy design
