Since 1959, the UN has designated international years in order to draw attention to major issues and to encourage international action to address concerns which have global importance and ramifications.

UN Resolution A/RES/64/136, Operational Paragraph 3:



What has happened since our last update...

In August, the first implementation strategy meeting of the UN Inter-Agency Network for the IYC, organized by UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA), took place. Representatives of the Food and Agriculture Organization, the International Fund for Agricultural Development, UN DESA, the UN Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia, UN-HABITAT, the UN Regional Commissions (NY) and the World Food Programme discussed, amongst other issues, the objec-

tives of the year, planned activities and advocacy strategy. The need to have a timely meeting of a communication team was highlighted. Other meetings during this initial phase of planning will follow.

Subsequently, the foresaid Communication team met and discussed the slogan for the IYC 2012.

In our view, the slogan should underline the twofold nature of cooperatives as a form of doing business while respecting the cooperative values and principles.

Internally, the ILO is finalizing its strategy for the IYC which has been put high on its agenda. In close cooperation with the COPAC partners and other stakeholders, the ILO aims to facilitate the activities of the international cooperative movement and to support them in achieving their objectives for the IYC. The ILO Director-General, Mr. Juan Somavia, and the President of the International Co-operative Alliance, Dame Pauline Green, met to discuss the collaboration between the two organizations in view of the preparations of the IYC. Was also present the recently appointed Director-General of the ICA, Charles Gould. Mr. Somavia agreed that the IYC provides an extraordinary opportunity to show the size and scope of cooperatives that people simply do not know yet. The IYC was to take cooperatives into the future, Mr. Somavia pointed out, underlining the sustainability aspect of this modern form of doing business.

- The organizational set-up will be formalized. The Secretariat shall start its operations as soon as possible. The first meeting of the Coordinating Committee is scheduled to be held before the end of 2010.
