



► The platform Monentreprise.bj in Bénin



1. What is the initiative and how does it work?

The Investment and Export Promotion Agency (APIEx) in Benin launched monentreprise.bj on 17 February 2020. It is a web platform that allows entrepreneurs to create their enterprise online, using a computer or an android device. The website is a one-stop shop that allows entrepreneurs to comply with all regulatory requirements on one digital platform. The entrepreneur needs only to present a valid identity document, birth certificate, passport photo and address. Every user must also provide details of the proposed business activities. This initiative was developed by the Government of Benin with financial support from the Kingdom of the Netherlands and technical assistance from the United Nations Conference on Trade Development (UNCTAD).

Creating a business in less than three hours is now a reality in Benin. This has been made possible through the digitalization of the registration process on the www.monentreprise.bj platform and the simplification and decrease in the number of procedures from six to one. The step formerly known as the "declaration of existence", which was obligatory, has now been eliminated. In addition, the interconnection and centralization of certain services within one single platform has eliminated various round trips between banks, notaries and other actors in the chain of business creation.

The prerequisite is to have an internet connection, a smartphone, or a computer. Once these conditions have been met, the entrepreneur creates a file by filling in a single form and uploading all the required documents online. The user can also check the availability of the enterprise name and choose the type of enterprise that should be created.



► A simplified process

Create your file.	Create your profile using the interactive guide, fill in the single form and upload your documents.
Pay fees.	Check the total cost of inscriptions fees, pay online or at the cashier desk of your one-stop shop (GUFE).
Get your certificates.	Receive electronic certificates by e-mail.

Monentreprise allows entrepreneurs to set up an enterprise and carry out all the necessary formalities online, without having to go to the Investment and Export Promotion Agency. After registering online on the platform, users receive a QR code generated by the platform, which enables them to obtain and print all the documents and certificates related to their enterprise. These include:

- 1. Business registration (*Immatriculation au registre de commerce et du crédit mobilier, RCCM*)
- 2. Unique tax identification number (Identifiant Fiscal Unique, IFU)
- 3. Public notice (annonce legale)
- 4. Declaration of establishment to the Directorate-General for Labour (DGT)
- 5. Professional ID (carte profesionnelle), valid for two years.



In other words, *Monentreprise* covers business registration and other registration procedures during the formalization process by applying a one stop shop concept, utilising synergies and making interagency coordination more efficient to the benefit of the entrepreneur. Various legal forms such as a single and multi-person or incorporated companies, firms with and without limited liability as well as economic interest groups can be registered. The platform also simplifies the process of tax registration and payment. For a sole proprietorship, a fee of 10,000 West African CFA franc (FCFA) (US\$18.00) applies. For a larger company, the fee is 17.000 FCFA (US\$30.60¹).

The fees associated with business registration can be paid online, on the same platform. Mobile payment is facilitated by Open-Si's payment aggregator "KKiapay", a single, customizable, online platform to make secure financial transactions via mobile money, credit cards, and bank accounts. Fees can also be paid online with a bank card, via mobile phone through Moov Money or MTN Mobile Money (money transfer platforms), or physically at an APIEx cash desk. After successfully completing these steps, the entrepreneur receives an email containing all the documents attesting to the registration of the enterprise.

2. What has been achieved?

The primary aim of this platform is to facilitate business registration, and support formalization. Entrepreneurs that register through this system do not pay any tax during the first year of their activities, but the tax authorities will thereafter be able to identify them. Monentreprise was launched just before the COVID-19 crisis, and it assisted in the acceleration of enterprise formalization. The number of businesses created between March and June 2020 averaged 2,783. Up to mid-May 2021, already more than 4,000 business have been created per month.

One-third of the entrepreneurs that registered through this system were women, half were under 30 and half were based outside Cotonou. Government officials were able to check documents and approve company applications from home, respecting a two-hour time limit. The creation of an online business registration platform was very timely, given the risks associated with in-person interaction during the COVID-19 pandemic.
