EIGHTEENTH ITEM ON THE AGENDA

Report of the Officers of the Governing Body

Request of the Republic of Maldives to attend the 97th International Labour Conference

1. The Director-General received on 19 March 2008 from the Government of the Republic of Maldives a request to be present at the 97th Session of the International Labour Conference (2008).
2. The presence of non-member States of the ILO at the International Labour Conference is regulated by article 2 of the Conference Standing Orders (Right of admission to sittings of the Conference), which, in paragraph 3, reads as follows: “Apart from delegates and advisers the only persons permitted to enter the body of the hall shall be: ... (e) persons appointed as observers by a State invited to attend the Conference”.
3. The Republic of Maldives has been a member of the United Nations since 21 September 1965. Thus, there is no legal obstacle for this State to be invited as an observer.
4. *In light of the above, the Officers of the Governing Body recommend to the Governing Body that it authorizes the Director-General to invite the Republic of Maldives to be represented by a delegation of observers at the 97th Session of the International Labour Conference, in accordance with article 2, paragraph 3(e), of the Standing Orders of the Conference.*
