Other financial questions**Financial arrangements for a commission of inquiry concerning the non-observance by Zimbabwe of the Freedom of Association and Protection of the Right to Organise Convention, 1948 (No. 87), and the Right to Organise and Collective Bargaining Convention, 1949 (No. 98)**

1. At its present session (November 2008), the Governing Body will have before it a report of its Officers¹ on the possible implementation of the procedure set out in article 26.4 of the Constitution, and the appointment by the Governing Body of a commission of inquiry to consider complaints submitted against the Government of Zimbabwe. Should the Governing Body decide to exercise its powers under article 26.4 of the Constitution to appoint a commission of inquiry, financial arrangements will need to be made to enable such a commission to proceed with its work.
2. The Programme and Budget for 2008–09 contains no provision for inquiries under article 26 of the Constitution. The past practice of the Governing Body has been to authorize supplementary expenditure whenever it has decided to establish a commission of inquiry under this article.
3. The procedures for such a commission normally involve an initial session to settle procedural matters, such travel as is necessary to gather further information, and a final session for the adoption of the commission's report. Resources thus need to be provided for travel, for the production and publication of the report of the commission, and for supporting staff. It is also proposed to make provision for payment to members of the commission of an honorarium of US\$300 per day. Based on this pattern of work, it is estimated that the cost of the commission will amount to some \$660,000, comprising:

It is proposed that these costs would in the first instance be financed from savings that may arise under Part I of the budget for 2008–09 or, failing that, through the use of the Provision for Unforeseen Expenditure, Part II. Should this not prove possible, the Director-General would propose alternative methods of financing at a later stage in the biennium.

4. *The Committee may wish to recommend to the Governing Body that, should it decide to establish a commission of inquiry concerning Zimbabwe, the cost of the commission in 2008–09, estimated at \$660,000, be financed in the first instance from savings in Part I of the budget or, failing that, through Part II, on the understanding that, should this subsequently prove impossible, the Director-General would propose alternative methods of financing at a later stage in the biennium.*
